



At the China Fort, in addition to the local gem purchasers, there are the international buyers from India, China, Indonesia, Japan,

Thailand France, Germany, Switzerland, United Kingdom and United States of America flock to purchase the very quality gems from here.

Thus the China Fort has gain a name and admiration in the international arena, as one of the most trustworthy and reliable gem markets in this part of the world. It is a location sure to provide gems brought from any part or any region of the world.

HISTORY OF GEM TRADE

The legend of China Fort reveals how with the passage of time it become the cynosure – the centre of attraction dealing in gem trade. The reliable historical sources say that Arabs have landed in the Sri Lankan soil long before the 6th century A.D. This mythical land has held the merchants spell-bound as they came in search of gems, spices and herbs.

Beruwala according to etymologists is result of coining two Sinhala words “Be” means ‘lowered’ and “Ruwala” giving the meaning to say ‘sail’ . , Thus the name Beruwala denotes, a place where the sails of the merchants from Arab, were been lowered. Arabs called this place ‘Berberyn,’ which connotes to the link it has to Arabic language “Berr” and Borr”.
